Cooperation Jackson works to place the ownership of land and control of production into the hands of the Black working class of Jackson, Mississippi.

Vision: Develop an ecologically regenerative, democratic economy rooted in the self-determination for people of African descent and radical decolonization of Mississippi.

Structure: Creation of a Solidarity Economy anchored in a federation of interconnected and interdependent worker owned cooperatives to meet the needs of the people and through the building a Community Land Trust to steward and develop land for common good.

Projects: * Freedom Farms, Center for Community Production, Green Team, Community Arts Festival *Transformation of a mall into Ida B. Wells Plaza to serve as an accessible space for cooperatives and hub for food sovereignty, time banking, and mutual aid initiatives
